

Troubleshooting Issues with Copying and Pasting Text in Browsers To copy text from a website, select the desired content, then right-click and choose 'Copy' from the context menu. If this feature unexpectedly fails, it can become a major inconvenience. Fortunately, there are multiple ways to copy and paste content beyond using keyboard shortcuts or the context menu. For instance, if you're using Microsoft Edge, recent updates have altered how URLs are copied. Starting with Edge version 87 for Windows or 88 for macOS, copying a URL from the address bar now pastes the webpage title as a hyperlink instead of the direct URL. While this might be helpful for formatted emails, it can cause issues when you need a plain URL. To adjust this setting, click the three-dot menu in the toolbar, select 'Settings,' and navigate to the 'Share, copy, and paste' section. Here, you can toggle between pasting the title as a link or the full URL. Remember to apply this change across all Edge profiles. Other troubleshooting steps include restarting the browser, checking for website restrictions, or disabling extensions that might interfere. If the problem persists, consider uninstalling and reinstalling the browser. While extensions enhance productivity, they can sometimes disrupt functionality. By following these steps, you can resolve copy-paste issues across browsers like Chrome, Safari, and Firefox. ###Troubleshooting issue with copying and pasting in Chrome browser. You can copy any web page by clicking but doesn't allow you to select the text and media, this method comes into very handy. You can right-click anywhere on the website to open a drop-down list. Select View source from that list, which opens the HTML code of the websites without disabling
JavaScript entirely, try these methods: For Chrome, go to Settings > Privacy and security > Site settings, searching for 'JavaScript, allowing/disabling it in site settings, and then enabling it back after copying content. Another method is to open the Edge Settings, search for JavaScript, disable 'Allowed' option, and remember to re-enable JavaScript entirely, try the address bar, find 'javascript.enabled', and toggle off its value from true to false. For websites that completely block copying text using Ctrl+C or right-clicking, you can try: Using print-to-PDF option by going to File > Print > Destination > Save as PDF. Open the saved PDF file and copy the text without issues. Take a screenshot of the website page and use an image-to-text converter tool to extract the text from it. To manually remove associated code while copying, you can try: Inspect element feature - select the desired text, right-click on it, and navigate through menus to 'Copy element'. This will copy the text along with its code, which you'll need to manually remove. Another method is using Ctrl+U to open source code, navigating through it, finding what you need, copying content, and then removing unwanted parts. Consider installing browser extensions such as Absolute Enable Right Click & Copy or Allow Right-Click that can force websites to enable right-clicking and allow text copy.
