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## Double barreled question

going to college can sometimes feel like a series of difficult decisions. not only do you have to do standardized tests such as atc or sat, you also have to decide which colleges to apply and write (practically) a million applications! After all this, choosing your major sometimes seems the easy part. but not so fast! Many schools offer a variety of specialization opportunities, including a graduate path indicated as a double major in which they focus not one, but two different subjects. this guide will remove the mystery from what it means to double greater! We will explore the ins and outs of the degree path, including: define what a double major is. and what is not, discuss the pros and cons of dual specialization, and finally, help to understand if a double greater is the right choice for you. So, without further ado... we plunge into it! priscilla du Preez/Unsplash what is a double greater? a brief introductionput: a double major is a graduate degreetwo concentrations, which are more commonly known as majors. But what exactly does that mean? First, you need to understand the differences between a degree and a major. Bachelor universities offer a number of undergraduate courses at three different levels: degree, degree of master, and degree of doctorate. The first degree you earn is a bachelor's degree, which takes about four years to complete. There are different types of degree degrees awarded depending on your major. The two most common degree degrees are the Bachelor of Arts (B.A) and the Bachelor of Science (B.S) A Bachelor of Arts is earned in any related liberal arts field. These include studies such as history, philosophy, English and foreign language. A Bachelor of Science earns itself in science-related fields such as biology, chemistry, physics and mathematics. Some universities offer additional degree degrees, such as Princeton Bachelor of Science in(B.S.E) or the Bachelor of Applied Science of the University of Pennsylvania (B.A.S). Regardless of what the degree is called, the most important thing to remember is that a bachelor's degree is what you earn to complete all the requirements of your university for a four-year degree. Major A major is a distinct concentrated study area within your graduate field. (Now that you know what a degree is, we bet that this makes more sense!) So you can think of a major as a study area within a field of study! Here is an example to make this even clearer: Let's say you go to Harvard because you want to be an engineer. Wait! There are different types of engineering, all which require different knowledge and skills. That's why Harvard offers seven different engineering majors: applied mathematics, biomedical engineering, computer science, electrical engineering, engineering sciences, environmental sciences andmechanical. when I wasto work in cloud computing, you will probably choose to graduate in computer science, and once you meet all the requirements of the program, you graduate with a degree in science! the double greater when you double greater, you will get a single degree/graduate that lists concentrations in two majors. in other words, as double major you will complete the graduation requirements for two separate majors, both in a unique grade field. Here's what we mean: We say that we want to go into politics, and hopefully work abroad as part of the United States embassy in France. to do this, you know you need a degree in political science and you have to be bilingual in French. Fortunately for you, your university offers a B.A. in French and a B.A. in political science. This could be a difficult situation if you were to choose between one major and the other — it would be difficult to determine which course of study is most important! That's whypart of universities offer a double greater: Major:meets the requirements for both fields of study, both will appear on your diploma. So someone who specializes only in politicl science will earn a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science, while your double major will result in a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science and French! But what does it look like from a practical perspective? Let's take a look! Meet Sophia, who has just been admitted to Cornell University. He decided that he wants to double more in history and philosophy (which are both part of the Bachelor of Arts). As part of the College of Arts & Sciences, Sophia's first job will be to complete all the basic college requirements for graduation. After reviewing the list, Sophia knows that she will have to take at least sixteen classes as part of her core. After that, Sophia takes a look at what classes she needs to take for majors in history and philosophy. The history department will require you to takehistory courses to earn a greater, greater,a main philosophy requires a minimum of eight courses of philosophy. To earn a double greater, Sophia will have to meet all criteria for each major and finish her basic studies. While earning a double greater might seem daunting, it is definitely a feasible goal. In fact, 12.5% of university students graduated with a double major in 2015. We will talk a little more about how to decide if a double greater is right for you in a second, but first, let's see what a double greater is not. Sboneham/Flickr What a double major is not a double major is not the only alternative to a four-year "typical" degree offered by most universities. (Yes, it is so, there are even more choices!) While we are focusing only on double specialization in this article, it is important to have a brief understanding of the alternatives to avoid confusion! A double greater is not a double degree A double degree ishow it sounds: instead of earning a degree with moreyou earn two separate degrees in two separate fields! This happens when a student completes the requirements for majors that give separate degrees. For example, we say that a student wants to study history of art and biology. since the history of art is a bachelor of arts and biology is a bachelor of science, this person will gain two separate degrees (a B.A. and a B.S)! Double degrees are considerably more rare than double majors because a student has to earn two separate degrees that often require different basic courses. If students are interested in another area falling outside their graduation field, many choose to earn a minor rather than a double degree. a double greater is not a minor the best way to think of a minor is like a "mini major" in another area of study that interests you! Minors usually require four or six additional courses, and are specifically designed to help students too little more knowledge in another area of interest. That's why children arecalled "secondary" enphase! For many students, a minor lets them dig in a field that completes their main field of study. For example, someone who studies American history may be minor in African-American studies, especially if they are interested in the civil rights movement. The important thing to remember is that a minor is how to immerse the finger in a subject, while a greater involves acquiring in-depth knowledge. This difference is reflected in your degree. While a double major lists both areas of study similarly, a minor is noticed as such - if it appears on your degree at all. This means that a double greater brings more weight, which can be very important depending on your future career! A double greater is not an emphasis Some majors require a student to choose an emphasis within the major itself. Unlike a minor, who is usually earned as part of a programan emphasis is a concentration on a specific subject area within a single major. For example, many English majors arechoose an emphasis because the field is so wide. These can be a certain period of time, a certain kind, or even a specific skill (such as grammar)! The goal of an emphasis is to offer a more tailor-made study within a major without requiring additional courses. Unlike a minor, which is totally optional, emphasis is often required to earn some degrees. For example, if you're graduating in education, your department may require you to choose an emphasis such as elementary education, secondary education, or even special education. Emphasis areas vary between departments and universities, but keep in mind that an emphasis is the less intensive addition of a four-year "typical" degree. In terms of order of importance, a greater transports more weight than a minor, which carries more weight than an emphasis! Put another way, a second major gives you much more in-depth knowledge of a subject than a minor orMax Pixel/Max Pixel 5 Pros to Double Major Now you're sixexactly what a double major is (and is not,) we talk about the advantages of double specialization. #1: You will develop unique critical thinking skills one of the interesting things about being a double greater is that you get to learn a lot about two subjects that really interest you. but this also means that you will have to learn to think in many different ways since the problem solving strategies you will have to succeed in combination! For example, a competitive Business Administration program will probably find someone who doubled in advertising and psychology a more convincing candidate than someone with just one major business-related. Your second major opens more opportunities.can be incredibly!If you are dream work is in a competitive industry. Here is an example of how this can work. steven graduated in geology and statistics. had hoped to work as a geologist of oil, but new laws and trade agreements have made these jobs rather scary. Instead, steven applies for (and land!) a role as a risk analyst for a large oil company. now that he is gaining experience in the oil and gas sector, steven will be a great candidate for any geological position that becomes available in the future. Additionally, a second major can help ensure more unique career opportunities. For example, someone who specializes in Spanish and marketing has put themselves in a fantastic position to enter the growing advertising industry in Spanish. your second major will make you a much better candidate for a position like this than if you graduated in Spanish or marketing alone. #5: you will develop aperspective One of the amazing things that happens when studying new ideas is thatgives you a new innovative perspective on existing problems. For example, did you know that susan wojcicki, a ceo of youtube, studied English and history in harvard? or that rashida jones, even a hallucination of harvard, graduated in religion and philosophy? double specialization gives you a solid knowledge base allows you to see things from fresh angles, which leads to unique ideas, concepts and solutions that other people would have lost! This is not only important for a successful career. can help change the world, too. 5 cons double greater now that we discussed the pretty impressive advantages of a double greater, let's take a closer look at some of the disadvantages of double specialization. #1: you have to plan your head already said it, but hear it repeating: if you want to double more, you must plan in advance, this means more than just looking at class deals before you can register. We're talking with your consultant the first weeks of youryear and mapping the course of study for the next four years. In addition, you need to understand the requirements of each major from get-go so that you can understand how to maximize your courses. For example, how many can count on both majors? Are there summer courses you can take to help speed things along? These are just some of the questions you need to think about to make sure you are doing the most of your time and money. #2: Can you take longer to graduate It is possible to graduate with a double greater in four years? Absolutely! But it takes careful planning, how to use your elective credits towards your major. The four-year degree plan also becomes more complicated if your majors are extremely different. For example, if you are graduating in Middle East Studies and Sociology, you will probably not have many classes that can count towards both programs. This can add eight (or more!)to your program, which may require an additional semester or two a#3: Double Majoring can make college more expensive Speaking of money...double majoring can be more expensive than earning a traditional degree because you will have to take additional courses. This means more than just a tuition excursion: It is also necessary to consider the cost of books, supplies, and even gas if you travel on campus more than usual. (This is especially important since many scholarships and scholarships only cover taxes!) Also, keep in mind that the total cost of college increases with each additional year that takes to finish school. While a year might not seem a long time, it is another year of rent, utility and food. This can add thousands of dollars to the total cost of your degree, so make sure you are planning both the course load and your budget carefully. #4: You will have less time to explore other interests Many students choose to useelective credits to help eliminate some of the requirements for their second major. This is a great plan, but it ismeans that you will not have the opportunity to take lessons that interest you only to learn more about the theme. (Receipts electives exist to serve this same purpose!) So, if there is a geology course on dinosaurs or a class of astrology on the solar places you would like to take, you might have to pass so you can put that time and money to your second major instead. #5: It can be difficult to participate in activities outside the classroom For many students, one of the most exciting parts of college are the things that happen outside the classroom. Whether it's typhoid on your football team or joining an all-campus chorus, universities provide students with tons of extracurricular opportunities to learn, play and grow. But when you are double specialization, your time is precious; It can be difficult to find enough time to combine extracurricular activities and make good grades in your courses. If you have responded mostly to two, you have all the basic skills that it takes to be a double greater! you are a good student, take an active role in your education, and know whatwork hard. But the increased workload of a double important means you will have to plan aheadYour usual. For example, one week start projects in advance only work if you have a project due, but most college courses require a final exam or a final project as the main part of the course degree. You will have to learn to be a little more proactive both study habits and your program if you decide to double more. If your answers were more than 3 Think instead of being a minor. It seems that you are not 100% sure of what you want majors in, much less what you would like your future career to be. And you know what? It's okay! Many people use their first year in college to explore their options before setting up on a major or career path. But because double specialization requires a lot of thinking and planning, it could make more sense to think of a minor instead.
