Farming in gaming refers to the process of replaying a specific area or series of areas with the goal of obtaining desirable items. This can include lootable objects such as chests, which may contain weapons, shields, class mods, or grenade mods. Players repeat this process by saving their progress and re-entering the game, allowing the chests to respawn and providing access to additional items. The Secret Armory of General Knoxx introduces larger chest types and new areas for farming is through respawning boss characters, which can sometimes drop valuable loot without needing to reload or save. Examples of farmable bosses include Crawmerax the Invincible in the General Knoxx DLC, who has a chance to drop Pearlescent loot. The Tundra Express in Borderlands 2 offers a developer's chest as an example of a farming area. These locations are based on proximity to the boss, not ease of drop. The dust run has a possibility of 5 oranges and up to 6 chests, including two red dahl chests. If you're looking to fill out your arsenal in Borderlands 2, here are 10 of the best weapons in the game and where to find them: the Grog Nozzle, a unique Maliwan pistol that applies Slag, restores health with Lifesteal, and boosts Critical Damage. It's a reliable way to apply Slag and restore health, making it a must-have for True Vault Hunter mode. The Baby Maker, a legendary Tediore SMG, explodes like a grenade when reloaded and spawns extra grenades, making it great for clearing out crowds. Other notable weapons include the Conference Call, a legendary Hyperion shotgun that shoots multiple shots in a row. You can find these weapons in various locations throughout Pandora, including the Beard Makes The Man mission and the fridge run. With these guns, you'll be well-equipped to take on the challenges of Borderlands 2. throwing it does so much damage so quickly, than shooting! Why Use It:It's a great option for taking down big enemies and bosses. Simply unloading a few Baby Makers does enough damage to down large targets. The damage is also scalable with abilities, making it a great option for gun focused builds. What It Does Best: Close Range Combat- chucking the Baby Maker at close range works great. Unloading DPS- Shooting, throwing, and repeating is a quick process with big DPS output. Scaling: Luckily, reload damage works off of weapon damage and ammo - meaning abilities that improve either or also improve the Baby Maker can drop from every loot source. The Pimpernel comes from Captain Scarlett's DLC, and is a unique Sniper Rifle with splash damage built in. Each bullet splits into an extra bullet, which then splits into another 5 bullets. They fan out in a star pattern, and each bullet is capable of hitting enemies twice, with a damage reduction of 50%. Why Use It: Hitting enemies more than once is always good. Critically hitting them multiple times is even better. Aiming the Pimpernel slightly off target, and letting all those extra shots hit does massive damage. What It Does Best: Hitting Large Enemies: Branching shots will hit big enemies more than once, dishing out a lot of hurt. Long Range Combat: like any Sniper Rifle, this gun works best for distanced combat. Critical Hit Damage: multiple shots can hit for critical damage multiple times. With its higher base damage, it's one of the top Sniper Rifles in the game, making it a must-have for players who enjoy long-range combat, especially those building around Zer0. It excels at: \* Ignoring Shields: The Amigo Sincero can skip shields and hit enemies directly, resulting in quicker kills. \* Taking Down Big Enemies: Bypassing shields helps with taking down big enemies with high health pools. \* Sniper Build Essential: This rifle brings a unique effect and great damage, making it essential for any sniper build. This means you'll heal from any damage source while using it. Its unique effect makes it easy to use and accessible. To find the Rubi, complete the mission Rakkaholics Anonymous and give Moxxi the booze to recover the pistol. Leech Grenade vs Fastball Manufacturer Savage Lee in Three Horns Divide often yields The Unkempt Harold loot drops; this is a viable spot for farming. You can also farm from other bosses, but the most effective approach is targeting specific items. Note that Terra spawns at level 52 and only allows access to legendary items if you're level 50 or higher. Utilizing "The Bee" method has been nerfed, so using it with high-rate-of-fire weapons may not be as beneficial. Furthermore, don't farm before reaching playthrough 2; instead, complete the necessary levels to maximize item drops.
